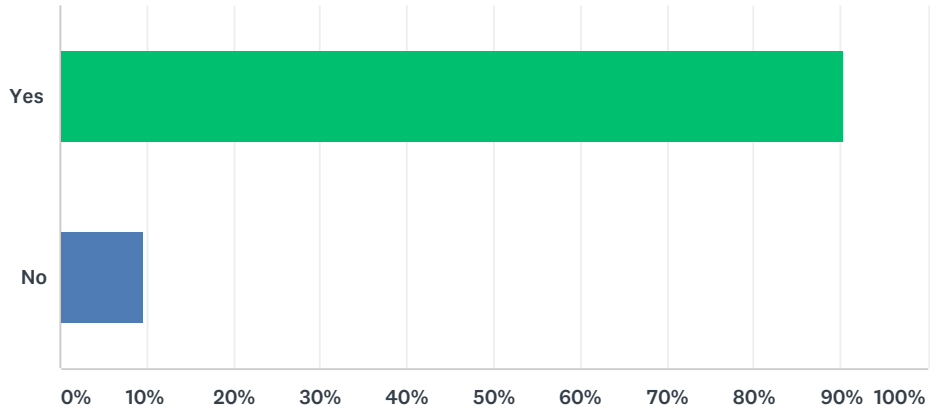


Q1 Have you ever visited the BMPL website?

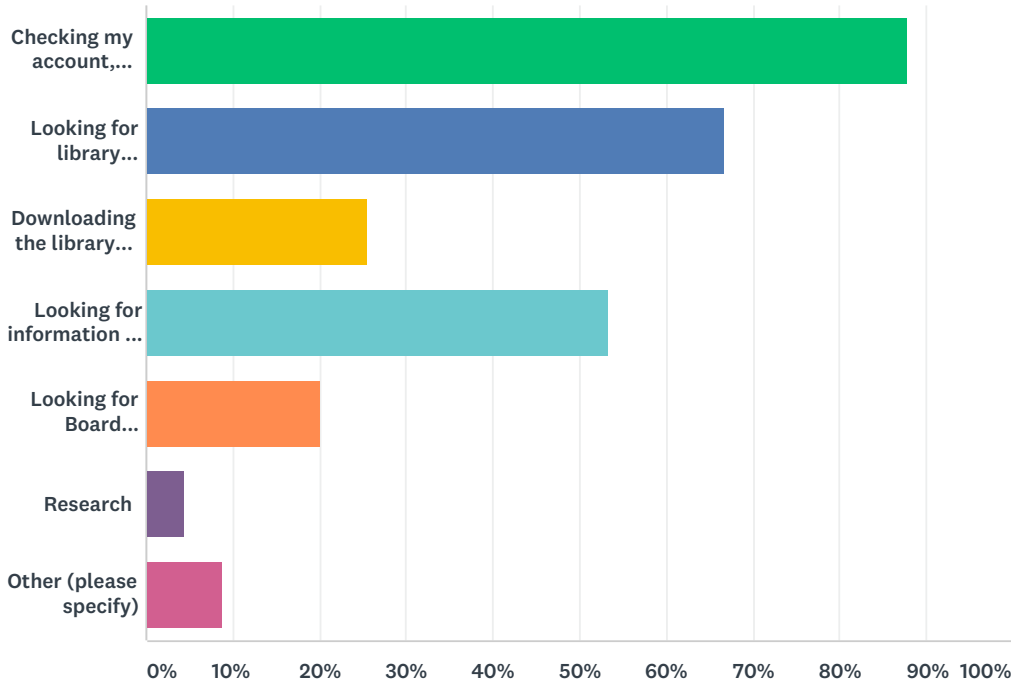

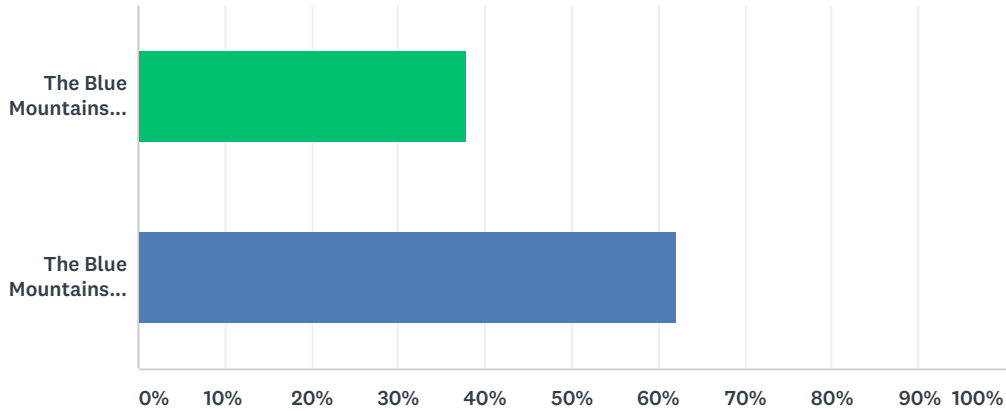

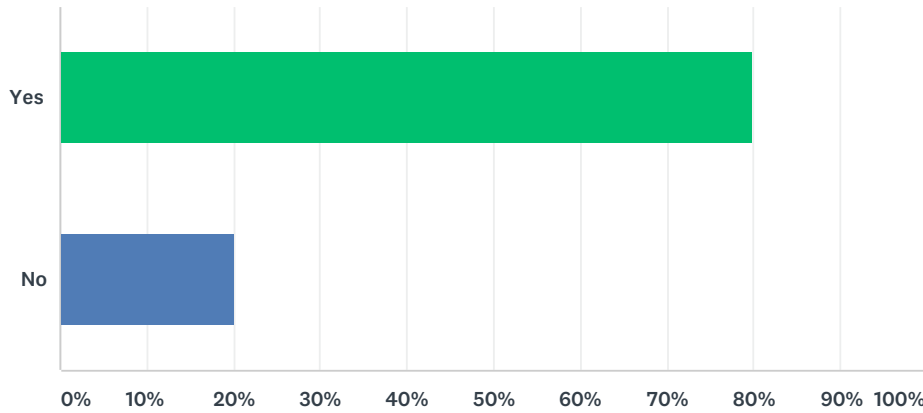
