Archives, museums, and libraries across Ontario take this time to share a love of archival materials with the public in creative ways. Library Board Corner

At the March 21st meeting the Board initiated a new communications forum entitled the Key Messages Update. This monthly release will be uploaded to the Board Minutes and Agenda page of the website and will include a variety of highlights of activities, key successes, and responses to challenges. These messages are provided by the Board, the Museum Advisory Council, the Arts & Culture Council, and the administration.

The Year in Review annual report was also approved at the last Board meeting, and will be released on the website in April, following formatting of the document.

The Library Board accepted the resignation of Paula Hope from the Board and provided notice of vacancy to the Town Clerk, in accordance with the Public Libraries Act. This position closed on March 29th. Council will make the appointment sometime in the future.

The Organizational Capacity, By-Laws & Governance (OC-BLG) Committee began the annual review of designated policies. These are slated to be presented to the Board at the May meeting. Also in May, the Board will be holding a full-day training meeting on 21st century GLAMs (Gallery, Library, Archive, & Museum). Following the first three months of Board orientation on legislation and policy, the Board is now prepared to begin training and planning discussions which will begin to move the Strategic Plan forward.
